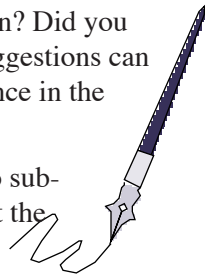

SPEECH TREK – ELEANOR STEM-ALLEN MEMORIAL SOARS INTO ITS FOURTH YEAR OF EXCITING SPEECHES!

Jill Birdwhistle, Chief of Strategic Advancement, Kate Farrar, Director of the AAUW Leadership Programs and Donna Lilly, past AAUW-CA Co-President had the daunting task of deciding the first place 2010 Speech Trek winner on Saturday, May 1st at the Speech Trek breakfast. Ela Banerjee, Roseville/So. Placer Branch, Melanie Nadon, East San Gabriel Valley branch and Haley Moss, La Mesa/El Cajon each gave an impassioned, poised and polished speech that made the judging extremely difficult. The contestants wrote and delivered a five minute speech to the theme of “If you could organize 100,000 AAUW members, millions of dollars in resources and thousands of volunteer hours to bring equality to women in one area, what would that area be?”

Melanie Nadon was declared the first place winner, winning \$1000, Ela Banerjee and Haley Moss each won \$500. All three contestants were also given \$100 gift certificates for “Bead for Life”, a company that enables women in Uganda to sell jewelry world-wide.

A special and moving tribute to deceased Roseville/So Placer Speech Trek Coordinator, Eleanor Stem-Allen was given by Gail Berberian, present Speech Trek Coordinator, and Gray Allen, spouse of Eleanor. Mr. Allen has established a Speech Trek memorial in his wife’s name, not only on the State level, but the branch as well.

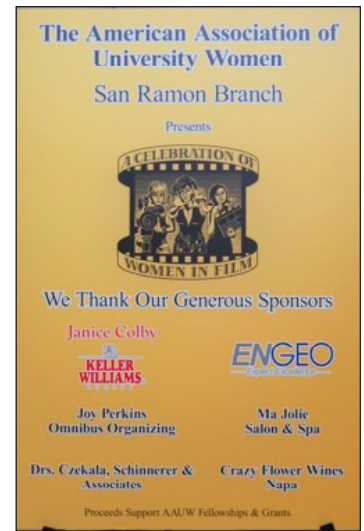
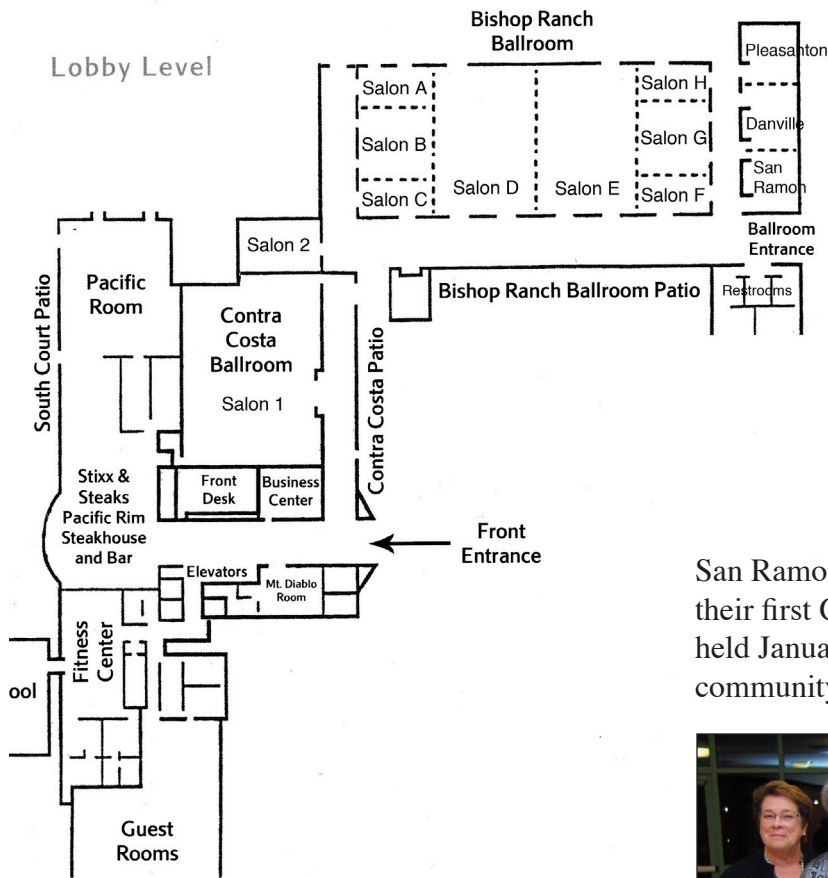
