AAUW CA Convention 2012, held in Santa Clara, was a fun and exciting event. Three days of presentations and workshops had great participation from our branch. Attending were Roseann Krane, Holly Sauer, Karen Large, Mary Ellen Blake, Rita Wustner, Carla Pancheco, Caroline Wood and Jo Harberson. In Friday's opening Business Session, our branch was honored with a $\$ 40$ Shop AAUW gift certificate recognizing our outstanding mission-based programs. Special thanks to Karen Large, Pat Gross and Norma Spencer for orchestrating our wonderful events, including Seneca Falls, Remember The Ladies, and Autumn Gem. A special thank you to Karen for preparing and submitting our recognition documentation to AAUW CA.

Our branch was a key recipient of branch recognitions at Sunday's closing AAUW Funds \& Legal Advocacy Funds presentation:

- First Place in AAUW Funds Top Branches, with $\$ 37,254.00$ donated
- Fourth Place in AAUW Funds Top Per Capita donations, with $\$ 140.58$ per member
- Second Place in Legal Advocacy Fund Top Branches, with $\$ 4,968.92$ donated
- Tenth Place in Legal Advocacy Fund Top Branches Per Capita, with $\$ 18.75$ per member

These are tremendous accomplishments that would not have been possible without the support of our entire branch for our Garden Tour, Holiday Home Tour, and branch member donations. Special thanks to our 2010-11 Garden Tour chairs Jacque Schubert and Dianne Tinnes, our Holiday Home Tour Chairs Mary Ellen Blake and Holly Sauer, the dedicated committee members who accomplished so much of the work needed to make these tours a success, and all of our branch donors and participants.
"Connection Corner" enabled branches to share exhibits of their programs and branch activities with other branches. Big thanks to Dora-Thea Porter who created a beautiful tri-fold display for our branch that was easily the most professional and beautiful display in the room! The tri-fold will be on display at the Garden Tour and our Fall Membership Brunch.
A great advantage of attending convention is the enthusiasm for new ideas gained from presentations, workshops, and other branches. Here are just some of the ideas we gathered and think are worth exploring. Do you like these ideas or have other ideas? Please let Holly Sauer know what you think.

- BITS program (Butts in the Seats): Arrange for members to attend women's sports games together.
- Community outreach: one "hands on charity" event a year, attracting a wider demographic in our community such as teens, their moms, younger women. AAUW-CA is focusing on hunger next year, perhaps tie into that.
- Use the AAUW Two-Minute Activist program: take one minute to read about the latest issue in Congress. Then, take one more minute to personalize a message and e-mail it to your member of Congress.
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- Bring a friend rather than rely on word-of-mouth for membership growth and success. Provide rewards to those who successfully bring in a new member.
- Increase our Public Policy activities. Women's issues need real focus. Advocacy is a top reason for membership growth among young women.
- Expand our partnerships with other organizations (maybe Girl Scouts, others?) and our participation when partnering; e.g. for Soroptimist, get our own breakout session with the Soroptomist event "She's All That!"
- Create our own "cyber-bullying" program/video for high schools. Video could address actions kids can take when bullied and could include role-playing.
- Expand our charitable activity to include helping young women get into college. There are kids in school who have very limited financial resources. According to a friend's high school daughter, these children are bullied the most.
- Build our own version of how San Jose branch creates new community projects: Any member may propose a new mission-based project to the board if a project lead is identified and a minimum number of members have agreed to participate in its execution.
- Join the local Chambers of Commerce.
- Participate in local street fairs


## Highlights of convention presentations and workshops:

- A plenary entitled "Bullies Anonymous" featured elementary students from bay area schools in a musical. This was followed by a presentation by Napa Valley branch on "Bullying and CyberBullying: A Community Concern", in which they shared research and provided suggestions about how we can help.
- "Miss Representation" was screened. Written and directed by Jennifer Siebel Newsom, the film documents media's often negative views of women and girls, and its role in the underrepresentation of women in positions of power and influence. Ms. Newsom was also a key-note speaker.
- The San Jose branch presented an insightful overview of the Community Action Projects supported by their members, including:
*Neighbors Helping Neighbors provides assistance to local charitable organizations, such as Second Harvest Food Bank and Next Door solutions for domestic violence.
*Technical Excellence partners with one local school to provide science and math projects and field trips for select middle school girls.
*Sports Equity Project monitors and supports Title IX compliance in high schools.
